Figure 1: Support mounting for #sbcw8963 DN (please note that AlN submount numbering is A00J2)




Figure 2: Output power as a function of the singlemode emission frequencies and temperatures




Figure 3: Applied DC current as a function of singlemode emission frequencies and temperatures




Figure 4: voltage and avg power vs current in continuous-wave operation (the solid squares indicate the maximum singlemode emitted power)
